Mike Keular has graciously extended an invitation to TSG to camp at his ranch in Olney, TX. We will be camping with Several TSG Troops on private property. Be advised, all times on the

weekend schedule are approximate. Parati Semper!

As guests, we are to respect our host. Safety must always be of primary concern: \*For safety reasons, cadets are not to carry unholstered weapons (BB, pellet, .22, etc.) outside the range. From a distance, a pellet gun may look like something else—so no firing outside the range. \*\*No latrines will be constructed. Please use the house facility when going #2. \*\*\*Each participant should bring \$5 cash or an ammunition contribution (.22 Handgun or LR).

#### FRIDAY

You may show up any time after 2PM Friday. Camp is about 2.5 to 3

hours from Collin County, depending on traffic. Maps and directions

follow.

Water and electrical available. Troops will want to pitch our camp's together. Park in the field south of the house shown at right. Fathers and sons are on their own for dinner. Troops will pray the rosary together at 8:00 pm.



Be advised, there should be some good stargazing opportunities being out in the country.

#### **SATURDAY**

Day starts with morning prayers and a flag raising ceremony.

Our troop will do breakfast together. Lunch on your own.

Adult volunteers will be needed to open the range. We will also need range masters, a teacher to lead pistol cleaning, a teacher to lead rifle cleaning and someone to score shooting. The range will open at 0900 hours. While participants take turns shooting, those who are waiting may participate in either a

pistol or rifle cleaning class. Shooting will commence between 0900 – 1200 and then from 1300 to 1430 hours.

Mass in the evening. We can arrange for confession times, or catch Rev. Mullan any time during the weekend.

Mike, our host, will provide pulled pork for dinner. Please bring bread, sides

and/or a dessert to share.



### MAP AND DIRECTIONS TO CAMP


## 1835 True Road Olney, TX 76374

# GPS COORDINATES: 33.279523, -98.654977

FROM COLLIN COUNTY: Take Sam Rayburn Tollway, I35E N, US-380 W, US-281 N and TX 114 W to FM1769 in Young County. Drive to True Rd.



Take FM1769 to True Road. Turn right and proceed 3.52 miles on True Road before turning left. Main house will be 0.47 miles further down on left.



I plan on getting there early enough to put up some green TSG directional signs. Find other members of Troop 77 to pitch our tents with. Troop 31 will



likely set its tents on or near the wooden deck area visible below.
